## The ARANAS*asri* (Arabic Language & North African Studies) Transdisciplinary Programme

Dear Colleagues and Students,

ARANAS is in a new groove, integrating diverse faculty expertise and institutional resources into its offerings that embed the teaching of the Arabic language into a transdisciplinary engaged liberal arts model. It seeks to restore academic, intellectual, and social status to the teaching of a key historic language by actively drawing on its varied geographies and communities as real participants, not mere observers or consumers.


ARANAS is an amazing opportunity to learn and grow academically and personally. The program is a great way to advance and improve Arabic skills as well as gain exposure to a new culture.
