All Arabic courses are established in accordance with ACTFL standards. We offer both Standard Arabic and Colloquial Moroccan Arabic. The courses are the following:

- Beginning Arabic For students with no prior experience with Arabic.
- Intermediate Arabic For students who have studied Arabic for 2 or 3 semesters.
- Advanced Arabic For students who have studied Arabic for 4 to 5 semesters.
- Arabic for Special Topics For students who have studied Arabic for 6 to 8 semesters.
- Courses in North African Studies regular include: History of the Arab World, Islamic Art and Architecture, and other courses

Professors teaching in the program

- Are national and international experts from various disciplines,
- Are full-time faculty in the undergraduate and graduate North African Studies programs,
- Have extensive experience.
- And are well-versed in both contemporary methodologies and use of technologies.


ARANAS students:
